





Why coordinate?


- Overlap of legal and planning instruments

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Governance

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


Stages of implementation

Measures (e.g. natural FM strategies)








Potential for win-win

Adaptation of new measures to take into account WFD objectives


Deterioration of status only allowable certain conditions are

fulfilled




